An extremely skilled and talented runner, this individual needs no introduction. But don't be misled by his talent alone because he is one of the hardest workers when it comes to training, motivation, and dedication to the sport he so loves. His perseverance and passionate drive have defined him as the outstanding performer he has been and continues to be.

Maurice Pointer has been running for 29 years and has been a member of the BRRC for 20 years. His honors in the running community include BRRC recognition and beyond.

Maurice has claimed the title of BRRC Runner of the Year in 1997, 2003, 2004, and again this year, 2007. He was named Most Improved Runner in 1987 and 1989. He has consistently won the BRRC Championship Grand Prix Series for his age group in 1989, 1997, 1998, 2003, 2005, 2006, and 2007. As reported by the Washington Running Report, he has ranked in the top 10 age group rankings for master's competition.

Maurice has over 50 USATF Masters Track and Field All American performances and in 2007 he was ranked number 1 in the men's 50-54 USATF Master's Outdoor 5000 and 10,000 meters.

Among outstanding records, he has a 2006 personal best mile of 4:47 and in 2007 he clocked a best 17:09 5K and 10:02 3K.

Maurice has served on the BRRRC Executive Board as a delegate, has volunteered on race committees and has experience sharing the role of race director.

His achievements and success demonstrate what a coachable runner can do. He is driven to learn, practice, perform and never give up.

The BRRRC is proud to recognize Maurice as a Hall of Fame member.
